I enjoyed conducting as part of a concert setting as it made me be more self-sufficient in what I was doing, knowing that Douglas wouldn't intervene, as well as giving me the chance to show my friends what I'd been doing! The conducting day at Homerton was a hugely invaluable experience. I learnt so much more about conducting not just from Douglas, but from my fellow conductors and also the choir. As a student conductor, I haven't had the chance to conduct such an impressive choir before, and the Ensemble of Friends were such a pleasure to work with. Their sense of unity and trust between one another when they sang meant that their reaction to each of the conductors' gestures were accurate and true to their meaning. Douglas' direction and comments were not only informative and practical but his advice was purposely directed at our own style of conducting and interpretation. Something I'velearnt from Douglas that is so important in conducting is that there is no one way to do it. Conducting isn't about the 'right way' of doing something, but the best way of communicating your interpretation to the choir without getting in the way of the music. Douglas' advice during the conducting day when responding to each conductors' gestures were always focused on adjusting and refining the conductors' interpretation and not creating clones of his own style. It was a pleasure meeting the other likeminded conductors who attend Cambridge and to learn from their techniques while they conducted their pieces. Overall, I feel very privileged to have taken part in the day and I look forward to using everything I learnt in my own rehearsals.
